Legislation news—a reminder about the enacted cell phone law that outlaws texting and using a handheld cell phone as of October 1st. Tickets will be issued starting January 1st 2012 with fines starting at \$50

2011 state law made stealing items valued at more than \$650 for a felony from \$250

12:26 Mark Crosby presented to the group on CPP training and certification covering alarms, fences, IDs, combinations for locks and computer passwords. A mock test included questions, discussions and answers about bomb searches, fire awareness, and emergency response, media interactions, strikes and executive protection.

Additional study tips were given for other certifications as well such as budget your time and take notes. Also due to the similarity in the subject matter you may consider taking the PSP at the same time. It will save you time studying and due to our busy schedules most people may not want to schedule another intense study session for the second certification.

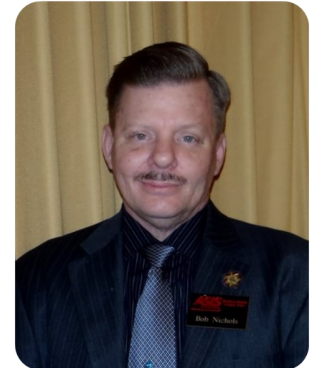
