carry on and become reality in 2012. We are planning a major overhaul of the Law En-



Legislation news—a reminder about the enacted cell phone law that outlaws texting and using a handheld cell phone as of October 1st. Tickets will be issued starting January 1st 2012 with fines starting at \$50

2011 state law made stealing items valued at more than \$650 for a felony from \$250

Chapter elections were conducted and in January the new roles will be as follows:




