FACEBOOK TO PROVIDE AMBER ALERTS

As of January 13, 2011, Facebook users are able to sign up to receive state-specific AM-BER Alert bulletins which will be sent through the Facebook "News Feed" feature. A total of 53 new AMBER Alert pages have been created, one for each state, Puerto Rico. US Virgin Islands, and the District of Columbia. Facebook users will also be able to share the AMBER Alerts with their friends. There are more

than half a billion users of Facebook. The new Facebook AMBER Alert pages represent an important expansion of the national AMBER Alert program.

nounced January 12, 2011, by Facebook, the US Department of Justice, and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC). 
