Christina spoke to the group about Emergency Response Coordination an how it effects our community and business. She reinforced that the time to plan for emergencies and gather resources is before an emergency. Once the emergency has commenced, there may not be an opportunity to make these contacts. When planning we should always consider that the communications networks that we rely on now and may list as our first source, such as phones and television, may not be available.

She reminded business to consider setting up pods with the county for the distribution of vaccines or medicine to their employees to ensure rapid response to as many in the community as possible. 
